Question

The standard specifies:

'The instructions for transformer toys shall contain the substance of the following, as applicable:

- the model number or specification of a suitable transformer for use with the toy'

The model number and specification can be provided on a label on the transformer for toys included in electrical sets. Therefore when the transformer for toys is provided with an electrical set, the Safety Notes can refer the user to the transformer label.

However toy electrical accessories which are intended for use with a transformer for toys can be sold without a transformer. If the electrical accessory is clearly sold as either analogue, digital ready or digital, they can be used on the corresponding transformer for toys in different regions. Therefore it would be incorrect to label an electrical accessory for use with a specific transformer model number or specification.

The transformer for toys is specific to the powerbase, not the electrical accessories.

Interpretations Group Answer /Action

The standard requires "the substance of the following" therefore reference to the instructions from the main set would be sufficient to comply with this requirement, provided that they comply with this requirement.
